Galatians 2:20

READ: Numbers 29:1-2

Day One

The Feast of Trumpets began a time of preparation for all God's people. It was a time to rest, blow the shofar—or trumpet—and anticipate the New Year and the Day of Atonement, which happened ten days later. The Feast of Trumpets was also a time for God's people to remember all He'd done in the past year and be thankful for all the ways He'd been faithful to them.

- Why weren't the Israelites supposed to do any regular work on the Feast of Trumpets?

- Why do you think the Israelites' offering was pleasing to the Lord?

THANK God for His faithfulness.

READ: Numbers 10:1-3, 10

Day Two

The Israelites knew that when this trumpet sounded, it meant something special. It was a sound of anticipation—they knew God was doing something, or they were going to do something to remember Him.

- What might people have thought when they heard the trumpets blow on those special days?

- What is something you do to celebrate special days?

PRAISE God on those special days in your life!

READ: Nehemiah 8:1-3

Day Three

Throughout the Bible, there are times when God's people disobeyed and ignored His Word. They forgot to celebrate the holidays and didn't take time to remember God's faithfulness. But God used faithful people to remind the Israelites of His Word. These people called Israel back to worship, and they remembered all of the ways God has been faithful to them.

- Why is it important to spend time reading God's Word?

- How can The Big God Story help us remember God's faithfulness?

REMEMBER God's faithfulness throughout the Bible.

READ: Romans 4:3-5

Day Four

This event took place when Israel had returned from 70 years of captivity. On the Feast of Trumpets, the people took time to read all of God's Word together so that they could remember all of the ways God has been faithful to them.

- What are some ways God has been faithful in your own life?

- Why is it important to take the time to remember and celebrate the things God has done?
