Deuteronomy 7:9

READ: Romans 4:16-17

Day One

When God told Abraham to leave everything behind, he obeyed. Abraham took responsibility for his faith by trusting that God was in control and that He would fulfill the promise that He had made.

- How are we “related” to Abraham?

- How was Abraham's faith in God similar to our faith?

PRAISE God for keeping His promises.

READ: Galatians 3:6-9

Day Two

Today we learned about how God called Abraham to leave his family and his home behind to go with Him on an adventure to an unknown land. God wanted to reserve a family and a people for Himself—starting with Abraham. This was all part of God’s plan to send Jesus through Abraham’s family line to redeem the world.

- If you could meet Abraham, what’s one question you would ask him?

READ: Genesis 12:1-3

Day Three

God keeps His promises in His timing and His way. He is Lord over all things. Though it might have been difficult for Abraham, he trusted God's promises. Through His covenant promise to Abraham, God promised some amazing things.

- Why was God's covenant promise so important?

KNOW that God is Lord over all.

READ: Matthew 28:19-20

Day Four

Throughout Scripture, God gives us promises for our lives. We can rely on God's promises because He is trustworthy and sovereign over all things, including our lives.

- What is the mission that God entrusted to us?

- How have you seen God be in control of your own life?

TRUST that God is in control.
