Remember Verse

“Be strong and courageous. Do not be afraid or terrified because of them, for the Lord your God goes with you; He will never leave you nor forsake you.”

Week Four

November 24-25

Deuteronomy 31:6

READ: Exodus 12:14-16

Day One

In the Bible, the Feast of Unleavened Bread is a spring festival linked with the Passover holiday. Both holidays remember the exodus from Egypt. On the night of Passover, the Israelites were supposed to eat lamb and unleavened bread. The Feast of Unleavened Bread began the next day, and the Israelites ate unleavened bread and no yeast for a whole week.

- Why did God want the people to eat bread without yeast?

KNOW that God is our redeemer.

READ: Exodus 13:3-6

Day Two

God showed His great power and love for Israel when He rescued them from slavery in Egypt. He redeemed them and set them free! By eating unleavened bread for seven days, the Israelites could remember how they had quickly left Egypt when God redeemed them.

- How did eating unleavened bread help the Israelites remember what God did?

- Why is it important to remember the things God has done in our lives?

THANK God for His great power and love.

READ: 1 Corinthians 5:6-8

Day Three

Throughout The Big God Story, yeast is also used as an example of something else: sin. When we read about yeast in the Bible, it helps us think about what sin is like in our lives. The unleavened bread people ate during Communion reminded them that Jesus didn't have any sin—in fact, He died for our sins! Because of Jesus, God showed again that He is Redeemer. He saved us—or brought us back—from our sins!

- What do you think the yeast represents in these verses?

- How does it make you feel to know that Jesus died for your sins?

ASK God to forgive your sins.

READ: Isaiah 43:1-3

Day Four

The Feast of Unleavened Bread reminded the people of God that He had redeemed them and set them free from slavery. As we celebrate this holiday today, we can remember that Jesus died for our sins to redeem us. He never sinned, and He was the perfect sacrifice for us.

- What are some ways we can remember and celebrate Jesus' sacrifice for us?

PRAISE God for setting us free.
